

Vocational rehabilitation

The differences between fee and funded services

The key differences between the fee based vocational rehabilitation solutions offered through Remploy, in comparison to those services offered through Government funded programmes are detailed below:

Vocational rehabilitation (employers – fee based)

- The aim is to return employees to work, by addressing any barriers or reasons for their absence
- Nationwide service delivery by Vocational Rehabilitation Association trained vocational rehabilitation consultants, in accordance to the Rehabilitation Code of Best Practice
- Adherence to service standards as per agreed service level agreements
- Specialist expertise in resolving both complex and minor absence cases
- Regular and comprehensive assessment and reporting to both the employer and employee
- Exclusive access to any resources that are local to the employee including:
 - Job search training and support (e.g. application forms, confidence building and overcoming barriers to employment)
 - Local labour market knowledge and employer contacts
 - Our Resolve service – a bespoke package to address workplace absence

Government public sector programmes (employers – funded)

- Employers cannot refer their employees directly onto these programmes
- A strict eligibility criteria exists regarding the extent of the person's disability and their hours of work
- There is no adherence to Remploy's vocational rehabilitation service timescales
- There are no comprehensive assessments or regular reporting processes in place
- Services are not provided in accordance to the Rehabilitation Code of Best Practice
